



Harrison McCain Scholarship/Bursary

The Harrison McCain Scholarships/Bursaries are available annually to entering students attending university who have graduated from a high school in Canada. Each award has a program value of \$16,000 payable over a four-year course of study in the amount of \$4,000 per year.

Criteria for the award includes a minimum average of 80% in your senior year of high school, financial need, leadership qualities and a recognized initiative in funding your own education. The number of scholarships/bursaries available may vary from year to year. **Renewal criteria to be met each year.**

The applicants are asked to submit a personal essay outlining their extracurricular activities, leadership, financial need, work experience and career plans, as well as what receiving this scholarship/bursary would mean to them.

DEADLINE: Applications must be received by March 1. If the deadline falls on a Saturday or Sunday, please ensure your application is received by UNB on or before the Friday prior to March 1.

The completed application package may be emailed to the Undergraduate Awards Office as a single PDF, faxed or mailed with the required signatures. The applicant must be able to supply the original documentation to the Undergraduate Awards Office upon request.
